ABSTRACT

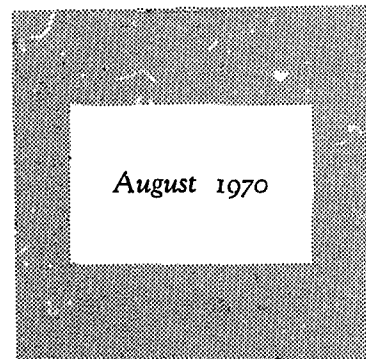
Almost all disciplines make extensive use of the resources provided by slide libraries and picture collections. Growing demands for pictorial material have stimulated a concern for making slide and picture collections more useful and more usable by better physical arrangement and more thorough indexing. The system provides a classification scheme for the organization of general collections of slides and pictures with a broad subject coverage as opposed to the more typical slide classification system which deals with a single subject field. A suggested method of automatic indexing is included. This document will be useful to builders of general collections, and is published as a tool for libraries and other collectors of slides and pictures who have had no ready-made system of classification available. THE NEED FOR A NEW CLASSIFICATION

Since the advent of television, pictorial materials seem to have taken on even greater importance to teaching in fields outside the normal visual world of the arts. History, anthropology, psychology, the sciences -- almost all disciplines make extensive use of the resources provided by slide libraries and picture collections. Growing demands for pictorial material have stimulated a concern for making slide and picture collections more useful and more usable by better physical arrangement and more thorough indexing. It is to this end that the development of this system is directed.

This is a classification scheme for the organization of general collections of slides and pictures. The term general is used to denote broad subject coverage and to make a clear differentiation between the scope of this work and the more typical slide classification system which deals with a single subject field, such as art. A preliminary edition of this work, which was distributed in January 1969 to a limited audience, was titled A Universal Slide Classification System. Universality of subject coverage is the ultimate goal, but use of that term at this stage of development might suggest too great a claim for what has been accomplished.

The classification system was developed at the University of California, Santa Cruz in response to a local need but with the hope that the product would meet the needs of many libraries. Eighteen months of intensive work on the project was supported by grants from the Council on Library Resources.

The basic requirements for a system that were set down before

developmental work began were these:

1. The collection, and hence the classification, should be general, encompassing the subject matter of all academic disciplines.
2. The arrangement of the collection should reflect a broad historical, cultural approach to teaching.
3. The filing arrangement of the collection should encourage and facilitate browsing, that is, visual inspection and comparison in the files.
4. In addition to being filed for easy browsing, the collection should be fully cataloged or indexed, preferably by automated means.

To the best of our knowledge or ability to discover no existing slide or picture classification system fulfilled all these requirements, particularly those of generality and indexability.

INTELLECTUAL CONTENT VS. VISUAL CONTENT

Why could not an existing general classification scheme for books be used for slides and pictures? There is an essential difference. A picture is more analogous to a sentence or a single word than to a book. It makes a single statement on a single theme; a book can be encyclopedic in its coverage or very narrow. Book classifications provide for the very general, the very specific, and everything between. Classification of slides and pictures can make use of only the most specific.

A picture cannot in itself develop a train of thought or a continuity of ideas. A series of pictures (motion pictures, filmstrips or picture sets) can easily be classified using the basic tools designed for book classification. But a single picture or slide is a static object without any function of sequence or continuity. Books can develop and deliver an explicit message; a picture's message is entirely in the "eye of the beholder", subject to many varying and even contradictory interpretations, particularly as it

is placed in varying sequences with other pictures.

Meaningful classification of pictures, then, demands reliance not on intellectual content of the picture, which is entirely subjective and dependent upon sequential development, but upon the visual content which can more nearly be described with objectivity. For instance, a president of the United States may be photographed while delivering to a college graduating class an address on farm policy. This could be construed as illustrating an aspect of education or of agriculture, and would be so construed by persons with special points of view. But the visual content of the picture is the president himself and the picture becomes a biographical statement about him. It belongs more properly with all other pictures of the man and his presidency than it does with the subject on which he spoke, or the locale of his rostrum.

The possible range of visual content is simply not as broad as the range of verbal content in books-- emotions, thoughts, concepts, imagination, speculations; these cannot become the visual content of a picture. The greater part of a typical book classification system therefore has no meaning for picture classification. A portion of one typical schedule from the 15th Edition of Dewey will illustrate the point:

A text written on any of these subjects could be profusely illustrated with related pictures but in no case could the listed subject be the visual content of a picture. A sovereign, yes -- but the concept of sovereignty, no. This will be true of most of the schedules used for book classification. A classification for visual phenomena must be cast in very concrete terms and this is why it appears necessary to create a separate and special classification system for slides and pictures.

A BASIC HISTORICAL APPROACH

A picture cannot depict the essence of theoretical subjects such as political science, education, religion, philosophy, etc. but only some isolated visual phenomenon -- an event, a person, a place, a thing -- phenomena that exist in an historical context rather than a theoretical one. The prime delimiters of historical context are time and place, and so time and place are given precedence over subject matter in the classification of pictures or slides. Most of the major subject classes found in the commonly-used book classifications will be found in this scheme, but found occupying a subservient place rather than a primary one.

The primacy of the historical factors reflects not only the inherent qualities of pictorial material, but also a basic need of the academic program at the University of California, Santa Cruz. Many of the "core" courses on this campus make a very broad cultural sweep through "Western Civilization", "Culture and Society", "Cosmos and the Arts", "The Third

World", etc. The interdisciplinary approach to the study of man and the humanities is apparently becoming more widespread. This classification system is designed to serve that trend. Every aspect of life in any particular era or culture is readily discovered in the file; cultures are easily compared and the whole movement of human history is laid out in a logical flow from past to present, from ancient to modern.

Every photograph is, in a very real sense, an historical document for it records some instant, some event, some situation, some person or thing, or some work of art at a particular time and place. Whatever was at that instant is captured on film to stand as an unalterable record of that instant. Representational art likewise serves as a direct documentation of history. Even non-representational art stands as an indirect document because it is a reflection of the culture that spawned it.

ART AND SCIENCE

In all the discussion to this point, it has been implied that pictorial matter of any sort is equally treated from the historical point of view. In fact, the classification is seen to have three basic divisions, History, Art and Science. In the beginning, it must be understood that History is a very inadequate term where it is used to label the first third of the classification. Its definition encompasses all subject matter except Art and Science (which have been pulled out as special cases) but reflects the fact that all the included subjects are expressed in an historical context.

Art is a special facet of History. Though the subject content of art may run the gamut from utilitarian artifact to completely imaginative abstraction, it still is a statement of its time and culture. Art has been assigned a large share of the notation capacity in the classification because it seems probable that in any truly general collection, art will be a dominant portion of the collection. Art could have been listed as a subject subdivision in the Historical portion of the classification, along with Agriculture, Business, etc., but this would have limited the potential capacity of the system.

Art has been placed parallel to History for another reason. In classifying art we observe some subtle variations in the principle of using visual content for the basis of classification. The visual content of a still life may be a bowl of fruit, but the primary concern is not with the painted subject content but rather with the fact of the painting. A photograph of the Parthenon, even though a record of conditions in the twentieth century, is placed in the Ancient period of Greek Art because our predominant interest is in the creation of the work, not in the later record of it. So in these two examples we see that the work of art itself is considered the visual content and classification centers on when, where, in what medium and by whom it was created.

Science requires yet another treatment. The principles of pure science know no age or national origin and cannot be compartmentalized chronologically or geographically. Therefore, they cannot be treated in the basic historical approach used for History and Art. The primary divisor in Science is

subject. In this the classification does not differ greatly from book classification, but an effort has been made to identify terms that are most meaningful to a pictorial collection. In the field of Science the diagrammatic representation of formulae and principles make the use of theoretical subject terms more possible than in the social sciences or humanities.

The discovery of scientific principles, however, can be described in terms of time and place. This forces the difficult choice of whether to class the act of research and discovery with the theoretical science or whether to place it in the historical context in which it occurred. The scheme is constructed to accommodate either approach; preference is given to including research with the theory while placing the end product, the application of science, in its historical environment.

OF THE SYSTEM

In making use of the classification, probably the most difficult decision to be made is the first, that of determining in which of the three primary categories a picture should be classed -- History, Art or Science. A sample list of questions is given below to suggest a method for arriving at the primary determination. Ask questions in the order indicated until a "yes" answer results. Go no further.

1. (Assuming some special local-interest archive) Does the slide or picture illustrate any aspect of the history, the people, the environment of the local community or home institution? If no -- proceed to next question. If yes -- class in History using special geographical tables that must be created to suit local conditions.

2. Is it a map of an identifiable locale on the Earth? If no - proceed to next question. If yes - class in History. (Extra-terrestrial maps are treated as Astronomy. Theoretical or unidentifiable maps of earth formations may be treated as Earth Sciences.)
3. Is it a work of art? If no - proceed to next question. If yes - class in Art. (Some items may be physically works of art, that is not produced by a camera, but be deemed to have no artistic merit. In such case the items may be considered in light of their historical or scientific content. On the other hand a photograph may be classed as Art if its subject content is indefinable or is clearly subordinate to its artistic qualities.)
4. Does it illustrate the theoretical principles of science, or the intellectual processes of scientific or technological research? (Not the end products of technology, since these are a part of the human environment.) If yes - class in Science. If no ---
5. Anything left over should illustrate some aspect of the history of man, his natural or artificial environment, his institutions, his activities -- class in History.

History remains the miscellaneous catch-all at the bottom of the list.

Since the historical approach is the primary approach of the whole system, everything is thus classed as history that cannot be positively identified as an exception.

The questions and their order reflect the collecting policy of the University of California, Santa Cruz Library. Each user should create his own priorities to suit local conditions. Many variations are possible in the application of the system. Even though the classification has been constructed with a basic hierarchy of time, place, and subject (or art medium) in that order, other patterns may be created with great ease. To accommodate local priorities other libraries may choose to rearrange the primary elements of the notation to bring geographical division, subject matter, art media or any other facet to a more dominant position.

Similarly, History and Art can be more closely integrated by rearranging the prime chronological schedules thus:

The fully developed call number consists of 18 digits arranged in three horizontal rows of six each. (figure 1) Many libraries may find that the top row is enough to provide the differentiation they need for a small collection. The top row is roughly analogous to the classification number in book classification, the second row to author mark, and the third row to title mark. In History the first six digits delineate chronological period, place and subject; in Art they delineate period, place, medium and style; in Science, subject and where applicable, place.

If a one-line call number is assigned, further control of filing is achieved by filing alphabetically the first word spelled out on the slide label. Since this is the word ordinarily coded in the next call number

Throughout the classification schedules that follow, a block diagram of the call number (similar to this Figure) occurs in the upper right-hand corner of each page. Each diagram identifies the element of the call number that is treated on that page and, in flipping the pages, the blocks serve as a visual guide for finding various schedules quickly. The 18 digits comprise 10 Sort Fields (as shown below) and the classification schedules are organized in the order of their corresponding Sort Fields.

field, the resultant order is the same.

When the full 18-digit call number is used there will be instances where each of the three rows is not filled out completely. Elements of the call number may be dropped from the right-hand end of the row but it is important for filing that whatever elements are used be continuous from the left in each row. For the sake of machine sorting, like elements must be kept in their assigned fields.

CAVEAT

This is not a classification of knowledge, but a structuring of that knowledge that appears capable of pictorial representation. It is not complete. It should not prove useful to collectors of specialized picture collections except as a method for organization and a skeleton upon which to add flesh. Hopefully, it will prove very useful to builders of general collections. It is published as a tool for libraries and other collectors or slides and pictures who have had no ready-made system of classification available before. Every user will expand and improve it.

A SUGGESTED METHOD OF AUTOMATIC INDEXING

Ease of cataloging or indexing was one of the basic goals in the development of the Santa Cruz Classification. An automated indexing method was developed concurrently with the classification system that yields catalog-type data as a by-product of classification. The method was designed to force a maximum output in natural language listings from a minimum input effort, utilizing only one punched card per slide. It is described on the following pages as a method, but is not necessarily recommended as the only method. It is, essentially, a method of printing indexes or finding lists to the collection.

If a traditional library approach to cataloging is preferred, it is recommended that use be made of the American Library Association's Anglo-American Cataloging Rules, Library of Congress Subject Headings, and the MARC II format for organizing information for data processing applications. The advantages would be (1) machine-readable data completely compatible with data describing other media, an important point if a library is considering a combined catalog of all media, both print and non-print, and (2) standardization in a cataloging system that has national and international acceptance in the book world and is gaining adherents in the audio-visual field. A disadvantage would seem to be a more costly cataloging process, one out of scale with the relatively low cost of the item being cataloged. Use of Library of Congress cataloging techniques, however, does not require the use of Library of Congress Classification. The Introduction to this work outlines the reasons

why the authors are convinced that the L. C. Classification is not useful for slides or pictures.

A totally different method for the retrieval of slides has been devised and tested by Dr. Robert M. Diamond, Director of the Instructional Resources Center, State University College, Fredonia, New York. Diamond's approach is to assign descriptive "identifiers" to each slide; unlimited numbers of identifiers can be given to any one item. The searcher queries a computer or other retrieval device with the code numbers of the identifiers he is interested in and receives, in return, a coded list of slides that have the desired characteristics. All information is coded and stored mechanically; no natural language catalog or index to the collection results from the process.

Any method of cataloging, indexing or retrieval can be used in conjunction with the Santa Cruz Classification without altering its primary usefulness as a tool for file organization. As an example, though, the Santa Cruz method for creating automatic indexes is described as follows:

The typical 2 x 2 slide with an aperture of $1\text{-}3/8$ x $7/8$ has space for two labels measuring $1\text{-}3/4$ x $1/2$. The top label bears the call number and descriptive information about the content of the slide. The bottom label contains additional information about the location of the object pictured and the source of the slide. (Figure 2)

Each bit of information recorded on the slide labels is also assigned to a corresponding field on a key-punch card. The format of the card has been designed to provide for sorting potential beyond that inherent in the call number. (Figure 3)

The encoded information for the sample slide, a Greek vase painting, reveals the following about the slide:

- Field 1 -- (J) places the work in the Ancient period of Art History, from the beginning of historic dating to the 3rd Century A.D.
- Field 2 -- (462) geographical code for Greece.
- Field 3 -- (R) identifies the art medium as ceramic or glassware, done by a known artist.
- Field 4 -- (K) denotes the Archaic style in Greek art, 600-480 B.C.
- Field 5 -- (E962) Cutter number for the artist's name, Exekias.
- Field 6 -- (B) identifies the Greek vase shape as an Amphora.
- Field 7 -- (R) identifies the subject matter depicted on the vase as Mythological.
- Field 8 -- (A178) Cutter number for the first word in the title of the work, "Achilles and Ajax Amphora."
- Field 9 -- (A) indicates that the picture is a view of the entire work.
- Field 10 -- (C) indicates that this is the third slide in the file of this view.
- Field 11 -- (EXEKIAS) the artist's name spelled out in full for visual scanning of the index. Field 5 provides the means for mechanical sorting and retrieval.
- Field 12 -- (ACHILLES AND AJAX AMPHORA) the title in full for visual scanning of the index. Field 8 provides for mechanical sorting and retrieval.
- Field 13 -- (B530) date of the work, read as 530 B.C. Since no hyphen follows the date it is understood to be a firm date and not an approximation.
- Field 14 -- (ROME:VAT) indicates that the present location of the work is in Rome at the Vatican.
- Field 15 -- (B13.2.7) reveals the commercial source of the slide as Budek and the gives the firm's catalog number.

Fields 9 and 10 are devices for arranging a multiplicity of slides of the same object in some meaningful order in the files, but these two fields

have little use as indexing devices. Fields 11 and 12 give the index user an "author-title" display in natural language and are not intended for mechanical sorting. All other Fields, however, have important potential for generating printed indexes to the collection.

Fields on the key-punch card are fixed except that a variable divider (diagonal line or slash) separates Fields 11 and 12; another separates 14 and 15. These two floating dividers allow better utilization of the very limited space on an 80-column card. Together the terms in Fields 11 and 12 may occupy 32 columns of the card. If one term is short, the other may be lengthened to fill out the space and thus record fuller information. The same is true of Fields 14 and 15. In printing, the 80 columns of punched data are expanded to 120 columns in the print format. This allows adequate spacing to make the printed lists more readable. The computer is programmed to react to the floating dividers (slashes) by moving the following character over to a fixed print field that will line the word up with others above it. (Figure 4)

Whenever possible, a date is entered in Field 13 to indicate the year of the event pictured or the date of the creation of a work of art. If the date is an estimate, or if a span of several years is indicated, the earliest accepted date is placed in columns 52-55 of the key-punch card and hyphen is entered in column 56. A firm date is entered in columns 52-55 without the following hyphen. B.C. dates are indicated by a preceding B in column 51. Prehistoric dates that exceed four digits are entered as subsequent scholarship often makes changes in the estimated dates.

In Field 14 is entered the location of an historical event or of a fixed work of art; the present location of a movable work of art is used. City name is preferred (if known) otherwise the next larger political or geographical subdivision is used. Location names are spelled out in full on both the slide label and the key-punch card; they are not Cuttered or otherwise coded. It is possible to sort these namcs mechanically although the process will be somewhat slower than sorting coded data. In addition to city name, the abbreviated name of a collection may be entered following the city when it is appropriate to a movable work of art.

The 15th Field is used as a record of the source of the slide with the expectation that this information will be useful in reordering or replacing a lost slide. A slide can generally be traced to one of three sources -- a commercial firm's catalog, a local cameraman who either took an original picture or copied an illustration from a book, or another slide from which a duplicate was made. Simple codes have been devised for the sources of the Santa Cruz collection; each library using the system can easily construct a system to meet its own needs.

The single-card format was purposely developed to keep the input effort to a minimum. By utilizing follower cards or perhaps other input techniques much fuller output information could be achieved. The example as it is presented here is somewhat analogous to "brief listing" in library cataloging -- it provides a good deal of basic cataloging data with a minimum of effort.

For many slides much more data -- important and even vital data -- could be encoded. For instance, group portraits may include dozens of identifiable people but the system as outlined allows for no more than two of them to be identified. A painting of an historical event is dated according to the date of the work of art, but the historian will also be interested in the date of the event pictured. Especially to encourage inter-disciplinary use of the slide collection, more added entries are called for.

Continuing development of the system might include on-line search and visual display, permuted indexes of multiple-word titles, and expanded printed indexes to include added title and subject descriptors. One of the basic goals of this project was to create a classification scheme that lent itself to both the traditional manual approach to slide retrieval and to the introduction of automated methods. A start has been made, but it is obvious that computer application can be carried much further.

Country names, or their equivalents, are given precedence; these stand in a column to the left and are intended as the primary choices in classifying HISTORY and ART slides. Terms indented to the right are terms denoting political divisions either smaller or larger than countries, or describing physical features unrelated to political boundaries. Many of these secondary terms will be needed to give adequate description to maps. In some instances a larger term, such as Africa, must be assigned to an art object when its point of origin cannot be more closely identified. In other instances it may be desirable to make use of smaller subdivisions. United States history might well be subdivided by state, however the art of the United States is better treated as a whole. A block of 95 numbers (650-745) is left at the beginning of the states list to allow each U.S. library the option of creating a special schedule for material of local or institutional interest.

In general, current country names are used, thus bringing under one number the whole scope of the ART and HISTORY of a geographical area even though its name may have changed many times through history. Flanders is noted in the list as an exception. The Flemish tradition in art history is so strong that to call Flemish art Belgian would be completely unacceptable. (See Flanders, 394) A special number is likewise provided for the Etruscan and Roman Empires (472) just ahead of Italy (474).

The second key word selected may be less specific than the first, modifying the first, perhaps identifying a second person or thing of nearly equal importance, or some landmark in the background which may occur elsewhere in the file as a primary element. It is important to note that terms entered in Field 2 will have little effect upon the filing order. The term entered in Field 5 is much more significant in placing like things together in the file.

Example: Within the classification of twentieth century U.S. Government and Politics, Nixon's Inauguration would be Cuttered in this way:

Field 5: N736 (Nixon)
Field 8: I350 (Inauguration)

By this means all pictures of Nixon's presidency would be kept together. If "Inauguration" were placed first, then all inaugurations would come together in the file but pictures of each president would be scattered.

City name need not be considered for inclusion as an entry in either of the Key Word Fields if the suggested key-punch format is utilized. The key-punch format provides a Field for city name outside the call number notation.



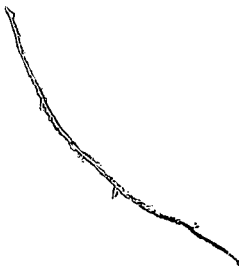

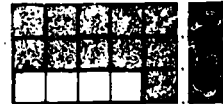

Use of this field is optional, but will be of use especially in the earlier chronological periods -- Pre-historic through Medieval -- in which the vast majority of art works extant are by unknown artists. Style is a property of art not easily defined, nor always agreed upon, but in certain areas of art history Stylistic terms take on great importance. In some parts of the world in poorly documented eras of history, Stylistic terms may be the only identifying labels that can be assigned to a work of art.

The Medieval period of Europe is an excellent example of this highly anonymous situation. Very few artists are known. The Styles of the middle ages cross national boundaries indiscriminately and overlap one another chronologically. Field 4 affords the means of relating all Byzantine works, for instance, regardless of how scattered they may be placed in the file due to their diverse geographic origins.

In periods later than the Medieval, Stylistic classification may also prove useful for the art of some countries. However, its use is not recommended in the later periods for the countries in the Western tradition. In these the majority of the art works will be identified by personal artist and use of the Style field would tend to fragment in the file the works of an individual who worked in more than one style. It is more important to keep the works of an individual together.

- A ABSTRACTIONS (Art which has no reference to known visible objects, art which is intended to be separate from natural appearances)
Accept at face value the title given a work by the artist, e.g., if an abstraction is titled "Landscape" class it as Landscape (P). Movements such as Cubism, Constructivism, Orphism, Futurism, Dadaism, Surrealism, Abstract Expressionism, and Non-objective Art are classed here only if unclassifiable elsewhere by content or title. The new movements of the 1960's are classed as Modern Art Movements (O).
- B ALTARPIECES (Decorative screens above and behind altars)
Use this class when the decorative material on the altarpiece is too diverse to classify as any single subject.
- C ANIMALS AND PLANTS

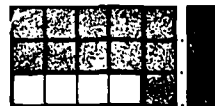

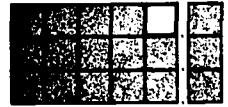

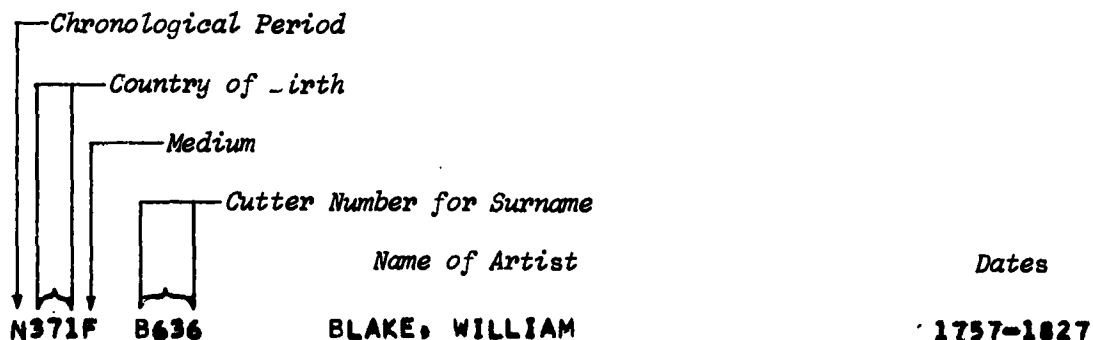

This authority list, containing over 4000 of the most commonly used artists' names, has been prepared as a primary classification tool, yielding in one "look-up" four different facets of information necessary to the construction of a complete call number -- chronological period to which the artist is assigned, the country of his birth, the Cutter number for his name, and a standardized spelling for his name. Also listed are his dates and the media in which he worked, facts which may help in determining that it is the right individual. Artists are normally classed in the country of their birth and the century of their death. The simplicity and directness of using these readily ascertained facts about an artist outweigh, in most cases, the desirability of placing a man elsewhere on the basis of subjective judgement about where or when he did his most important work.
