


Fig. 1 The distribution of equivalised disposable household income in COME-HERE from January 2020 to January 2021 in France, Germany, Italy and Spain




Fig. 2 Lorenz Curves in COME-HERE from January 2020 to January 2021. *Notes*. These figures refer to the analysis sample from the COME-Here survey. "Income" refer to equivalised disposable household monthly income in Euros and PPP




Fig. 3 The evolution of Relative Income Inequality in COME-HERE from January 2020 to January 2021. *Notes*. These figures refer to the analysis sample from the COME-HERE survey. "Income" refer to equivalised disposable household monthly income in Euros and PPP




Fig. 4 Generalised Lorenz Curves in COME-HERE from January 2020 to January 2021. Notes. These figures refer to the analysis sample from the COME-HERE survey. "Income" refer to equivalised disposable household monthly income in Euros and PPP




Fig. 5 The evolution of Absolute Income Inequality in COME-HERE from January 2020 to January 2021. *Notes.* These figures refer to the analysis sample from the COME-HERE survey. "Income" refer to equivalised disposable household monthly income in Euros and PPP
