

Europe. Redhead et al. (1994, and references therein) mention that basidiomata may arise directly from soil where all visible traces of a host (presumably from last year) have disappeared. In montane Latin America, where *Russulas* of temperate origin are more plentiful than they are elsewhere in the region, I have never seen species of *Collybia*, even where members of *Russula* subsect. *Nigricantes* (a select substrate) are exceedingly common. I suspect that *Collybia* is of north-temperate origin (like some of its preferred substrates), but, as yet, has not migrated to the American tropics.
