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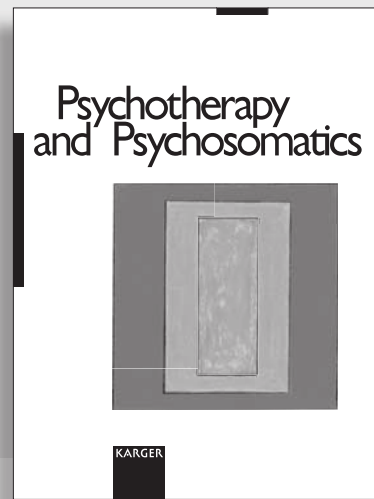

- Promote research on the etiology, prevention, identification and treatment of substance use and related disorders.

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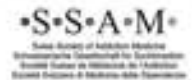
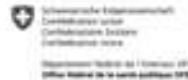


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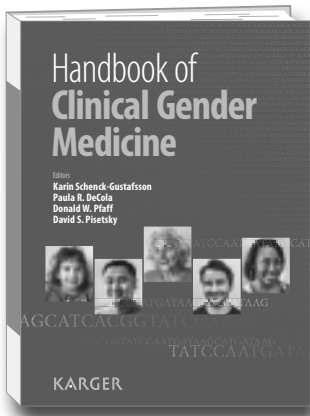
