Separately, a number of carefully performed observational studies<sup>84,85,86</sup> have demonstrated that patients who follow their prescribed treatment plan and adhere closely to prescribed therapeutic regimens show a number of favourable outcomes including fewer symptoms and exacerbations, reduced use of rescue medication and even reduced loss of lung function over the years.<sup>87,88</sup> Conversely, poor adherence is associated with increased morbidity and poorer clinical outcomes.<sup>89,90</sup>
