## ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Professor H. H. Plaskett, President, in the Chair

The Minutes of the preceding Annual General Meeting were read, confirmed and signed.

The President having appointed the Scrutineers, the Society proceeded to the ballot for Officers and Council for the ensuing year.

The Secretary read extracts from the Narrative Report of the Council.
The Report of the Honorary Auditors was read (see p. 20).
The Secretary, in the absence of the Treasurer abroad, remarked on a few items in the Accounts relative to the financial state of the Society.

A vote of thanks to the Honorary Auditors of the Treasurer's Accounts for 1946 was proposed and carried unanimously.

It was proposed and carried that the Report of the Council be received and adopted, and that it be printed and circulated in the usual manner, together with the Report of the Honorary Auditors and the President's Address.

The Secretaries, on behalf of the Council, moved the adoption of the amended Bye-law 22 below, which was put to the Meeting, and after some further explanation from the Secretaries, adopted unanimously :-
22. The contribution of each Fellow shall, for the first year, be five guineas, or three guineas, according to the month in which he may have been elected (viz. two guineas in all cases as an admission fee, and three guineas as the first year's contribution, if such election has taken place in the month of January, February, March, April, May or June ; but only one guinea as the first year's contribution if such election has taken place in the month of October, November or December), payable at the time of his election ; and three guineas for every subsequent year ; the first of such subsequent contributions to become due and be payable in advance on the Ist day of January in every subsequent year.
The Scrutineers reported to the President the result of the ballot, and the names of the Officers and Council elected for the ensuing year were read to the Meeting. (The list of names is given on p. 15I.)

The newly elected President (Professor W. M. H. Greaves) and the Secretaries (Professor W. H. McCrea and Dr A. D. Thackeray) then took their places.

The thanks of the Society were given to the retiring President (Professor H. H. Plaskett), Vice-Presidents (Dr H. R. Hulme, Professor E. A. Milne), Vice-President and Deputy Treasurer (Mr J. H. Reynolds), Secretary (Mr D. H. Sadler) and other retiring Members of the Council.

The thanks of the Meeting were given to the Scrutineers of the ballot.
The Meeting then adjourned.
