## Notes on contributors

Edward Benson is a solicitor with Browne Jacobson in Nottingham, where he is head of the Employment Department. He has a degree in mathematics from the University of Cambridge and, having qualified as a solicitor, first practised in the City of London. Edward then worked at Incomes Data Services as assistant editor of handbooks and supplements before moving on to Industrial Relations Services where he was editor of the *Industrial Relations Legal Information Bulletin*. He has written widely in the area of employment law, particularly in relation to redundancy and industrial conflict.

Mark Carley is editor of the European Industrial Relations Review, the monthly journal covering industrial relations developments across Western Europe and EC social policy. Having studied at the University of Leeds, the University of Manchester and Bolton Institute of Higher Education, he worked for British Rail and in further education before joining Industrial Relations Services in 1988. Formerly visiting lecturer in industrial relations at the Polytechnic of Central London, he has a particular interest in 'social dialogue' and European-level information and consultation initiatives.

Bernard Casey has been a senior research fellow at the Policy Studies Institute in London since 1986. He studied at the University of Oxford and the London School of Economics following which he worked for six years in the Labour Market Policy Research Unit of the Wissenschaftszentrum Berlin (Science Centre Berlin). Bernard has acted as consultant to the OECD and has carried out research for various UK government departments and the Commission of the EC. He has published books and articles on a range of subjects including non-standard forms of employment, older workers and retirement and the active labour market policies of various OECD countries.

Susan Cox joined Industrial Relations Services (IRS) in 1987. Since then she has worked as research officer and acting editor of the *Industrial Relations Legal Information Bulletin* (now the *Industrial Relations Law Bulletin*), specialising in discrimination law and the effect of the European Community on employment
